Resolution Copper Company provided this training for the CWG on the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) at the request of several group members. The 4-hour training was conducted by Mr. Rhey Solomon of Shipley Group, who has extensive experience in this area including as a former senior Forest Service employee at the local and national levels.



The training provided an overview of four main topics related to NEPA:

- Overview of NEPA and CEQ (Council on Environmental Quality) regulations
- Records management
- Types of documents
- Scoping issues

Solomon asked the group what their expectations were for this session, and they outlined a desire to learn more about the law, its implementation, its terminology, and the Forest Service process; how to get the CWG, the public and elected officials more involved in the process; and how NEPA works to protect the environment.

The presentation included many details of the legal requirements, policy interpretations, and litigation history and rulings related to NEPA and agency implementation. Solomon explained the differences between the various types of studies conducted under NEPA such as Environmental Assessments and Environmental Impact Statements, and detailed the factors considered in deciding which level of analysis to conduct. He highlighted the importance of public comments during NEPA processes and gave the group advice on how to prepare the most useful and legally-defensible comments on documents. He also described how 'third-party' contracting works, which is how the Tonto National Forest will conduct the EIS for the Resolution Copper Project.

Attendees were given a book entitled *Overview of the NEPA Process*, prepared by Shipley Group. All agreed that the session was informative, worthwhile, and helpful. They thanked Mr. Solomon for speaking with the CWG.
